WITNESS TO:

WHEREAS, Section 7503 of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services
Code, 35 Pa. C.S. Section 7101 et seq. mandates that **Schuylkill Township** prepare,
maintain and keep current an emergency operations plan for the prevention and
minimization of injury and damage caused by a major emergency or disaster within this
Borough; and

WHEREAS, in response to the mandate stated above, this Borough has prepared
an emergency operations plan to provide prompt and effective emergency response
procedures to be followed in the event of a major emergency or disaster; and

WHEREAS, this Borough has also prepared an emergency operations plan in
order to reduce the potential affects of a major emergency or disaster and to protect the
health, safety and welfare of the residents of **Schuylkill Township**;

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the undersigned Borough Council of **Schuylkill
Township** does hereby approve, adopt and place into immediate effect the
Emergency Operations Plan of **Schuylkill Township**. This Plan shall be reviewed every
two years to make certain that it conforms to the requirements of the Schuylkill County
Emergency Operations Guideline.

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT FOR EMERGENCY SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, made the 2nd day of April, 2003, by and between the Sch County Board of Commissioners and the City, Boroughs and Townships of Schuylkill County, all of which are political subdivisions of Schuylkill County, by their duly elected and incumbent Borough Councils, City Council, and Boards of Supervisors, hereinafter referred to as "the Political Subdivisions of Sch County", and more specifically referenced in Attachment I to this Agreement.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7504 of the Emergency Management Services Code (35 Pa. C.S.A. Section 7101 et seq.), County and local coordinators of emergency management shall develop mutual aid agreements with adjacent political subdivisions for reciprocal emergency assistance, which mutual aid agreements shall be ratified by the governing bodies of the political subdivisions involved; and

WHEREAS, by mutual execution of this Agreement, the Political Subdivisions of Sch County desire and intend to formalize the agreements and arrangements relative to reciprocal emergency assistance by and between said Boroughs, Townships and City:

NOW, THEREFORE, WITNESSETH: that, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and agreements contained herein, the Political Subdivisions of Sch County hereby agree as follows:

1. The Political Subdivisions of Sch County agree to furnish Emergency Services, as defined in Section 102 of the Emergency Management Services Code, to each other upon request, upon a non-reimbursable basis. No Political Subdivision of Sch County shall present any claim of any nature against any other Political Subdivision of Sch County for compensation for any loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring in consequence of the performance of the services called for in this Agreement.

2. This Agreement shall apply to the following circumstances and/or situations:

(a) The dispatch of emergency service equipment and/or personnel by one or more Political Subdivisions of Sch County in response to the occurrence or the threat of a man-made, natural or war-caused disaster;

'The Emergency Management Services Code defines these services as firefighters, police, medical and health, rescue, disaster warning, communications, shelter, evacuation and other named emergency response and recovery services.

(b) The distribution of materials, supplies, equipment and other forms of aid by and between the Political Subdivisions of Sch County;

© The staffing and equipping of an emergency operations center responsible for coordinating the emergency response activities of either one or more Political Subdivisions of Sch County affected by an actual or imminent disaster emergency;

(d) The dispatch of emergency service equipment, material and/or personnel by either one or more Political Subdivisions of Sch County in response to a Declaration of Local Disaster Emergency declared by either one or more Political Subdivisions of Sch County;

(e) Response to incidents (actual or imminent) which endanger the health, safety or welfare of the public and which require the use of special equipment, trained personnel or personnel in larger numbers than are locally available in order to reduce, counteract or remove the danger caused by the incident;

(f) Participation in exercises, drills or other training activities designed to train personnel to prepare for, cope with, or prevent the occurrence of any disaster emergency.

3. Any dispatch by one or more Political Subdivisions of Sch County of emergency service equipment and/or personnel pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the following terms and conditions and be in accordance with the _____ County E.M.A. Alarm System: which includes Sch County E.M.A. HAZ-MAT Response Units.

(a) Any request for aid hereunder shall state the amount and type of equipment and/or personnel requested, but the amount and type of equipment and number of personnel to be furnished shall be determined by a representative of the responding organization.

(b) The responding organization shall report to the officer in charge of the requesting organization or his designee at the location to which the equipment and/or personnel are dispatched, but shall be subject to the orders and operational control of the responding organization's officer on scene.

© The responding organization shall be released by the requesting organization when the services of the responding organization are no longer required or when the responding organization is needed within its normal emergency services area.

4. Plans for the orderly evacuation and reception of evacuees of one or more Political Subdivision of Sch County by the other Political Subdivisions, resulting from a disaster/emergency situation, shall be developed by representatives of the party Political Subdivisions and their local emergency management service organizations. Such plans shall include the manner of transporting evacuees, the number of evacuees to be received at different locations, the manner in which food, clothing, housing, and medical care will be provided, the registration of the evacuees, and all other relevant factors.

5. This Agreement shall become effective immediately upon its ratification by two or more of the Borough Councils, City Council, and Boards of Supervisors of the Political Subdivisions of Sch County listed in Attachment I to this Agreement as evidenced by the execution of their respective Attachment II page with the Sch County Board of Commissioners. Duly authenticated copies of the respective Attachment II pages of this Agreement shall, at the time of their execution, be deposited with each of the other participating Political Subdivisions and with the Sch County Emergency Management Agency.

6. This Agreement shall continue in force and remain binding on each Political Subdivision until a Borough Council, City Council or Board of Supervisors takes action to withdraw therefrom. Such action shall not be effective until thirty (30) days after notice of the withdrawal has been sent by the Political Subdivision desiring to withdraw to the other Political Subdivision that are parties to this Agreement.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the undersigned Political Subdivisions of Sch County, by their respective Borough Councils, City Council, and Boards of Supervisors, as set forth on the attached pages of Attachment II, have duly executed this Mutual Aid Agreement for Emergency Services on the respective dates listed on those Attachment II pages.

Attachment I

This Mutual Aid Agreement for Emergency Services supersedes and replaces any earlier Mutual Aid Agreements between the various Political Subdivisions of Schuylkill County. These "Political Subdivisions of Schuylkill County" and the Parties to this Agreement, once they have acted in accordance with Paragraph 5, are:
